***Famous Kansan's Birthday: Lynette Woodard***

Lynette Woodard, born August 12, 1959 in Wichita, KS, is best known for being the first female member of the Harlem Globetrotters. Her early basketball career included playing for KU, where she won All-American four times, leading to her being the first KU woman honored by having her jersey retired, and where she earned the distinction of major college basketball's career women's scoring leader. Post-college, she played for Italy & Japan, won the gold medal as part of the 1984 U.S. Olympics team in Los Angeles, and played for two WNBA teams, the Cleveland Rockers & the Detroit Shock. She retired from playing in 1999, and has been inducted into the National High School Hall of Fame, the Basketball Hall of Fame in Springfield, Massachusetts, and the Women's Basketball Hall of Fame in Knoxville, Tennessee.

CLIFTON CITY COUNCIL  
July 26, 2010

The Clifton City Council meeting was called to order by Mayor Haas on July 26, 2010 at 7:00 p.m. Council members present were N Adkins, J Tillinghast, M Affolter & G Bouley. Bernie was also present. Shirley Leiszler was present to observe.

Minutes of the June 28 meeting were read & approved as read. Motion by J Tillinghast, 2nd by M Affolter to allow Pay Ord # 843. 4 ayes - motion carried.

Comments were made about unlicensed drivers on 4 wheelers and ATV's. Drivers must have a valid driver' license.

Clerk said she talked to Prairie Land about a street light on West Street. Jim Coash is to contact Adair Martinez about this light. Prairie Land is to be contacted about possibly helping take tree out at old water tower site. Gary talked to Mike Hanson about repairing the shelter houses and he is also to give an estimate for the firehouse repair.

Clerk is to send another letter to Walthers Oil about old building. Sewer problems are not quite so bad. Still a lot of rubber gloves and paper towels in sewer. Guys are to check on speed limit signs at Care Home. This fall possibly working on drainage at West St & 3rd streets. Shower in women's dressing room at pool needs to be repaired.

Pump #10 has not been running efficiently. KRWA would like to try their method of repair before spending a lot of money. Bernie will call him to go ahead.

New tractor has been delivered. Clerk is to get a job description from Ron for a new Ambulance Director. Clerk is to look into prices for a telescoping flagpole.

Trent Winter wants to purchase Bee House. Apparently it belongs to the City. Mike Ryan made up a Quit Claim Deed. Motion by M Affolter, 2nd by J Tillinghast to deed the land to Trent Winter. 4 ayes – motion carried.

Gary said radio guy is to look at the west fire siren. It is not receiving the signal and has to be started by hand.

Motion by J Tillinghast, 2nd by M Affolter to approve Ord. #425, approving the transfer of franchise from Galaxy Cablevision to Zito Midwest LLC. 4 ayes – motion carried.

Motion by N Adkins, 2nd by M Affolter to adjourn at 8:15 p.m. 4 ayes – motion carried.
